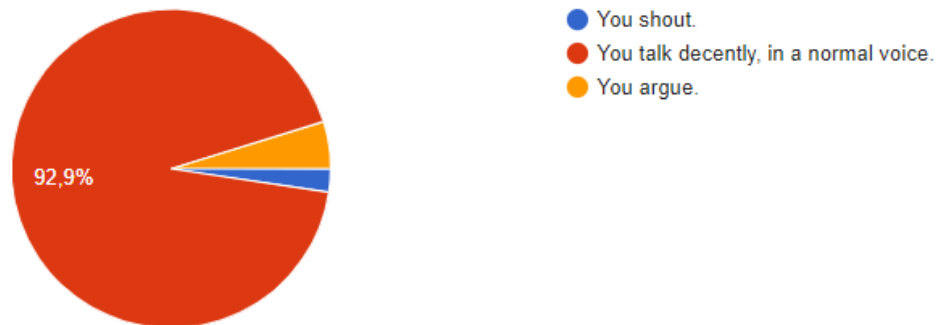


NETIQUETTE SURVEY – THE RESULTS

Here we present the results we obtained from the Netiquette survey. 84 students wrote their answers to the questions.

1. You are talking to another person via Internet:

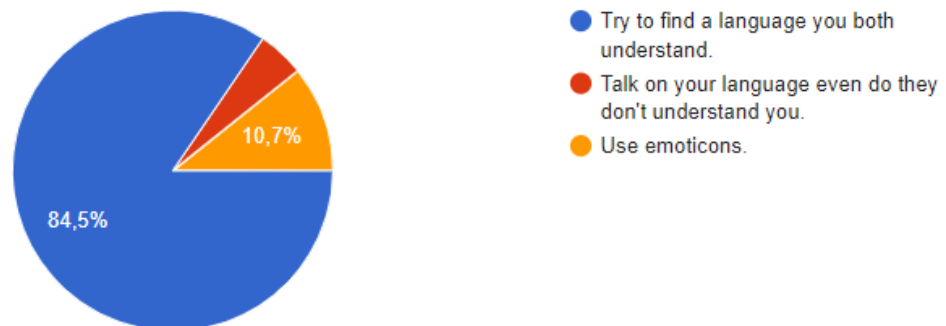

As we can see, a great majority of students know that they should be polite and not argue. There are some students that chose the wrong answers. We believe that they were only joking.

2. The person is from another country and does not understand you:

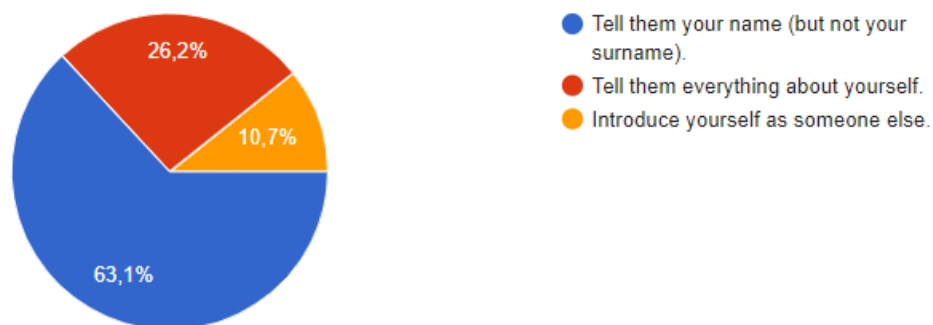

The answers to this question show that the majority of the students know they should try to find a language that they both understand. There are some students that chose the second best answer which are emoticons. We believe that all of the students are correct.

3. You are trying to introduce yourself:

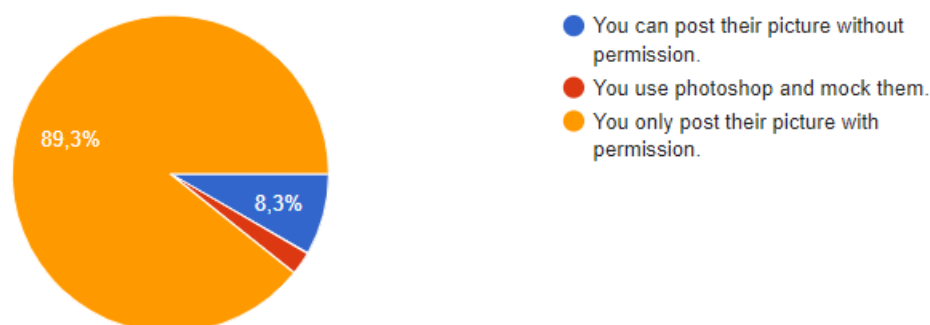

A little smaller percentage of pupils know that they should not say everything about themselves. Some of them even chose the answer to introduce themselves as someone else. We believe that you should never introduce yourself as someone else - what if the person you are talking to knows something of the person you are imitating?

4. You have a photo of someone else.

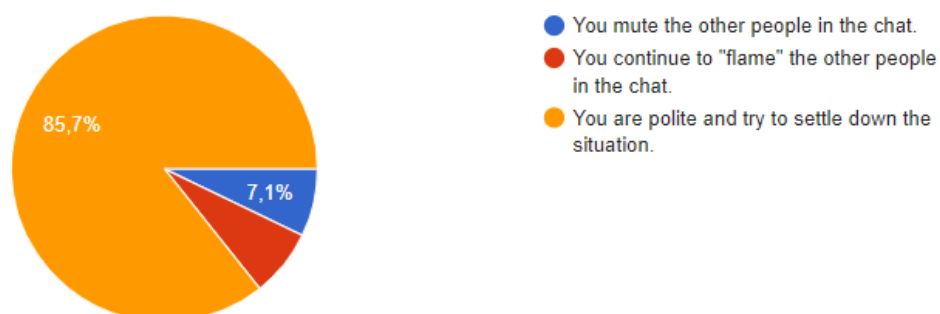

In this case, although 89.3% of students know they need the permission to post the picture, some of them chose the wrong answer because if it is not your picture NEVER post it on social media.

5. You are in an argument:

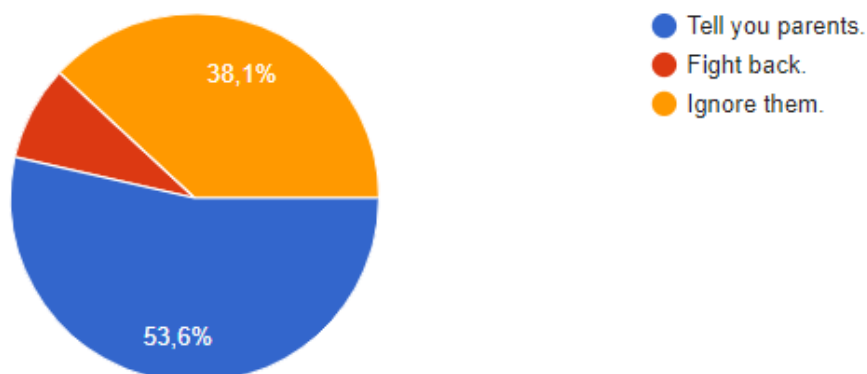

These answers show that a smaller percentage of the pupils believe that is OK to "flame" others but "flaming" just makes every situation worse.

6. You are being cyberbullied:

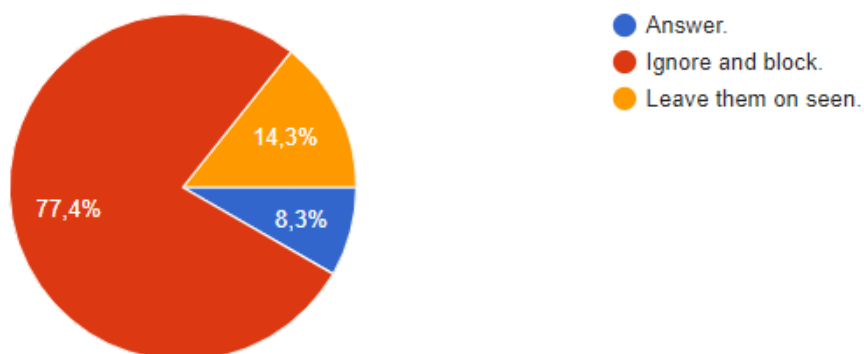

It is good to see that about 90% of students know that they should tell someone that they are being cyberbullied or to ignore the comments, there are still those who try to fight back, but NEVER fight back because it makes the situation worse.

7. You received an unknown message:

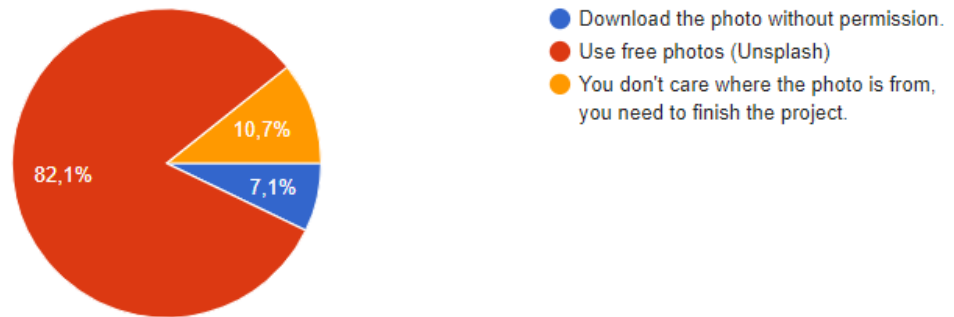

A lot of students normally find themselves in this situation. The best thing that you can do is to ignore the messages from people you do not know. Some students believe they should answer, which is a bad thing to do because the message may contain a virus. For those who do not know what *seen* means, seen is when you look at the message but do not answer, which is not a bad thing sometime,s but still it is best to just ignore and block the unknown message.

8. You have a school project:

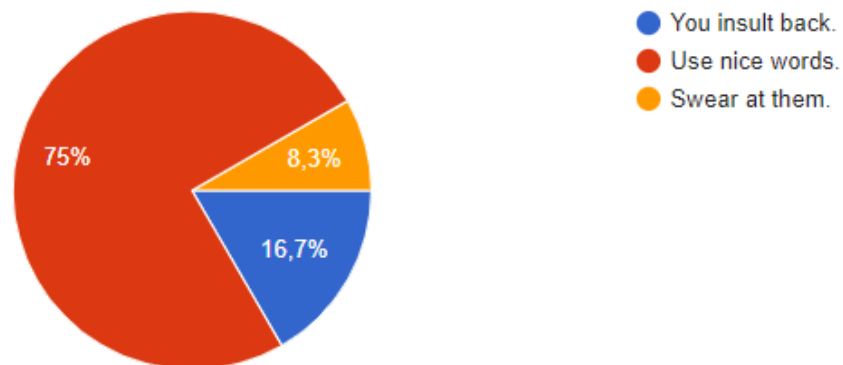

The answers to this question show that a majority of the students know that you can get fined for using photos without permission, and some of the students think they need to finish the project which is normal to not think a lot when in a hurry, but on free internet pages there are a lot of free photos and you can almost find everything you need.

9. Someone starts to insult you:

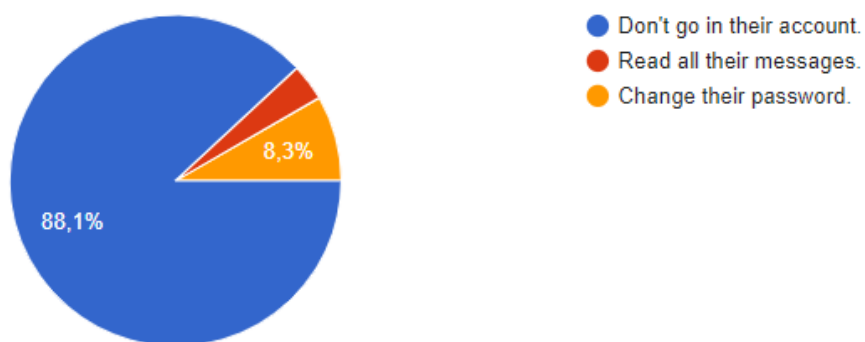

These answers show that although at first you might feel like swearing back and insulting these people, 75% of students know that you should be polite in any case. Anything you write down can be used somehow against you.

10. You have a password of another account:

If you have a password for another person's account, 88.1% of students would not use it to log into that person's account. Still, there are some who would like to be a bit naughty. It would be best if someone has a password of an account to just leave the account and to tell the person that he should change the password or make a new account.
