

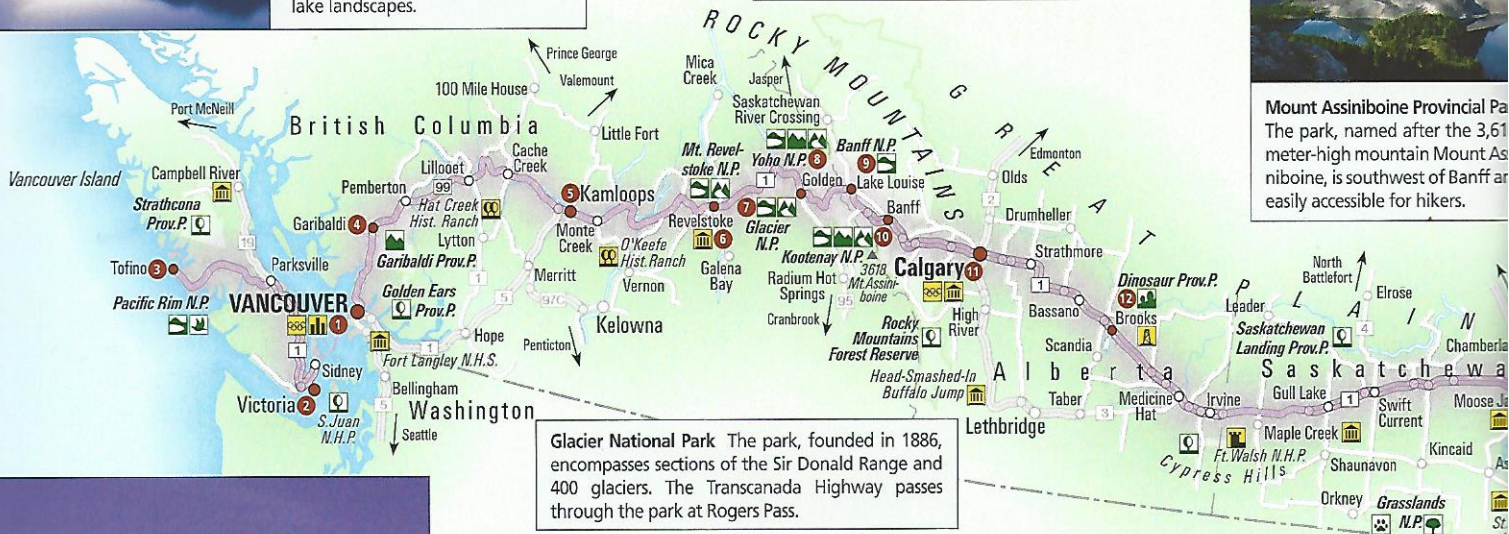


**Garibaldi Provincial Park** The park near the world famous winter sports resort of Whistler encompasses diverse and beautiful mountain and lake landscapes.

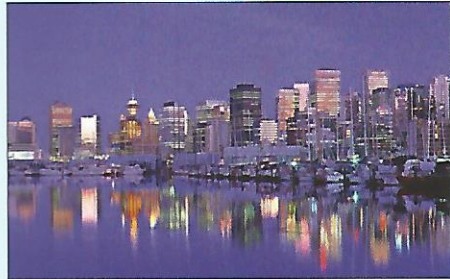
**O'Keefe Historic Ranch** The ranch transports visitors to the 19th century. The Victorian main house contains most of its original furnishings. The ranch also includes several reconstructed historic buildings.



**Mount Assiniboine Provincial Park** The park, named after the 3,611-meter-high mountain Mount Assiniboine, is southwest of Banff and easily accessible for hikers.



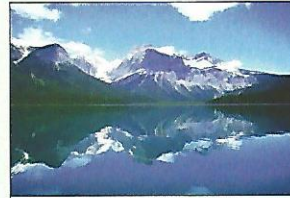
**Glacier National Park** The park, founded in 1886, encompasses sections of the Sir Donald Range and 400 glaciers. The Transcanada Highway passes through the park at Rogers Pass.



**Vancouver** The city with its spectacular natural setting between the sea and mountains is often ranked among the world's most beautiful urban areas. Major attractions include historic Gastown and Stanley Park.



**Mount Revelstoke National Park** 1,938-meter-high Mount Revelstoke is surrounded by fertile meadows with lush vegetation.



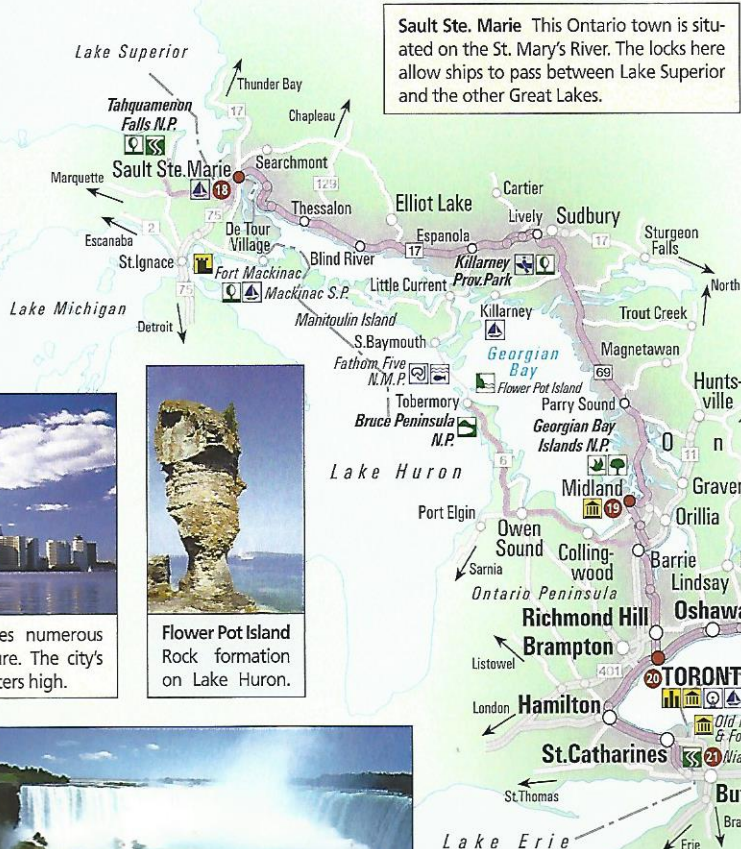
**Yoho National Park** This park in the Rocky Mountains encompasses glacial valleys, waterfalls, and beautiful Emerald Lake.



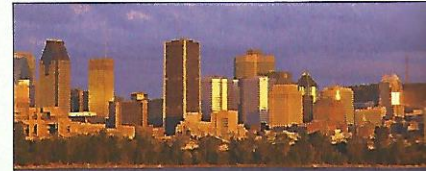
**Calgary** Once known as "Cowtown", Calgary is now the center of Canada's oil industry. The city is also the site of the Calgary Stampede, the world's largest rodeo.



**Tahquamenon Falls National Park** This natural attraction on the Tahquamenon River is 20 meters high and is the largest waterfall in Michigan.



**Sault Ste. Marie** This Ontario town is situated on the St. Mary's River. The locks here allow ships to pass between Lake Superior and the other Great Lakes.



**Montreal** French Canadians and other French speakers make up more than two-thirds of the population. Quebec's largest city. The city, famous for its cosmopolitan atmosphere, is situated on the St. Lawrence River.



**Toronto** Canada's largest city features numerous examples of striking modern architecture. The city's tallest structure, the CN Tower, is 553 meters high.



**Flower Pot Island** Rock formation on Lake Huron.



**Cove Island Lighthouse** The lighthouse is the major landmark in the area.



**Niagara Falls** The 50-meter-high waterfall encompasses American Falls and Canada's Horseshoe Falls.

**Lake Ontario** The easternmost lake of the Great Lakes is also the smallest with an area of around 20,000 km².



**Ottawa** Canada's capital is on the border between Ontario and Quebec. The neo-Gothic parliament building is the city's best known landmark.
