Oklahoma City An oil drill and a statue of a Native American woman situated in front of the state capitol building reflect the state's history.

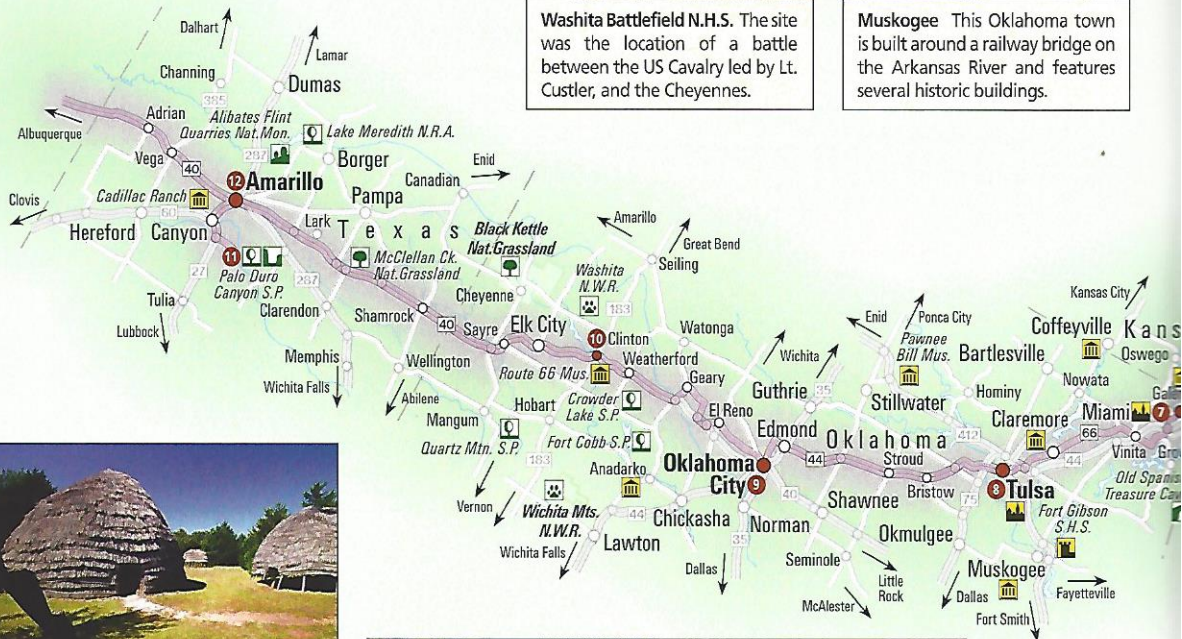

Washita Battlefield N.H.S. The site was the location of a battle between the US Cavalry led by Lt. Custer, and the Cheyennes.



Muskogee This Oklahoma town is built around a railway bridge on the Arkansas River and features several historic buildings.



Anadarko The so-called "Indian capital of the nation" is home to the Southern Plains Museum, dedicated to the culture and history of the Plains Indians.

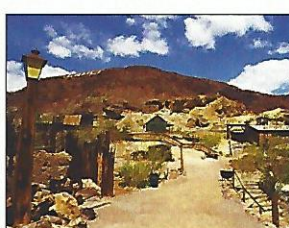


Pea Ridge National Military Park Located near Rogers, the park is located at the site where a major civil war battle with 26,000 soldiers involved occurred in March 1862.

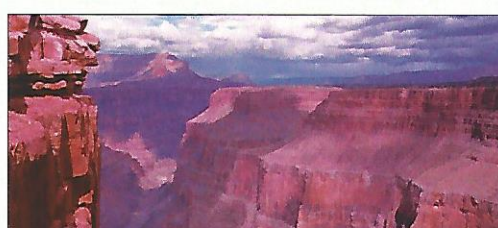

San Bernardino The city is located in the "Orange Empire", an important center for citrus fruit production. The California Theater is a remnant from the "Golden Age" of Hollywood.



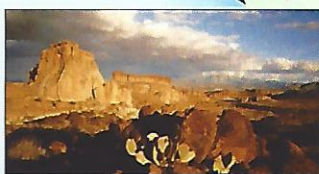
Calico Ghost Town The town was abandoned in the early 20th century following a "silver rush".



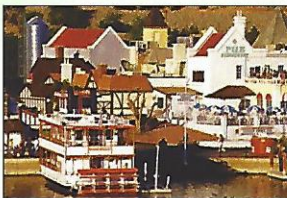
The Grand Canyon Located in Arizona, the largest canyon in the world is around 1,700 meters deep, 30 kilometers wide and 450 kilometers long. Visitors to this natural wonder can enjoy spectacular views of the canyon's multicolored walls and the Colorado River from many areas along its edges.



Joshua Tree National Park The national park is famous for its Joshua trees, a type of cactus related to yuccas. Mormon pioneers named the trees after the biblical figure, Joshua, who led the Israelites to the promised land.



Hualapai Mountain Park The park near Peach Springs is located in Hualapai Canyon, an arm of the Grand Canyon.



Lake Havasu Tourists can enjoy a relaxing stay on one of the houseboats lining this small lake.

Sunset Crater The 300-meter-high crater is a section of the 5,000-km² San Francisco Peaks lava fields. Sunset Crater encompasses spectacular lava cones and many other ancient volcanic formations.
