

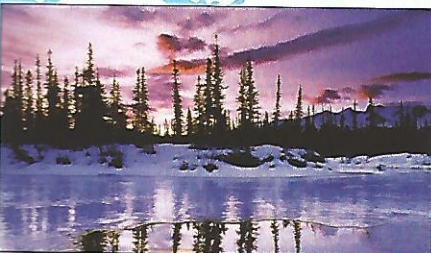
Kitwano Provincial Recreational Area

Mount Robson Provincial Park The national park, founded in 1913, is named after Mount Robson (3,954 m), the highest mountain in the Canadian Rockies. The region's glaciers, mountain lakes, and waterfalls are popular attractions with park visitors.

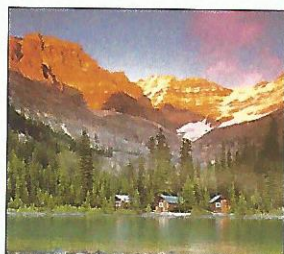


Prince Rupert The world's largest population of orcas (killer whales) lives off the northwestern coast of British Columbia. Twice a year large schools of gray whales pass through the waters near the town.

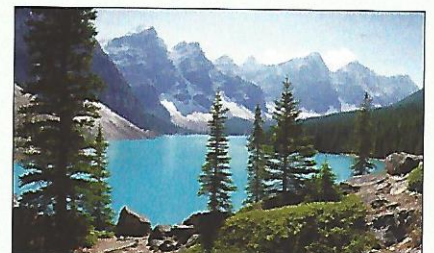


Jasper National Park The largest national park in the Rocky Mountains encompasses a beautiful mountainous region with crystal clear lakes, majestic peaks, and the famous Athabasca glacier.

Mount Revelstoke National Park The highlights of this nature reserve include its lush mountain meadows, which can be reached by the 25-kilometer-long Meadows in the Sky Parkway.

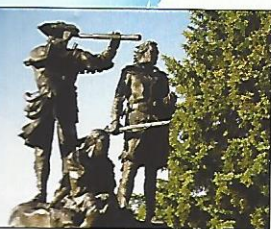


Yoho National Park Takakkaw Falls and the 500-million-year old fossils of the Burgess Shale Rocks are both interesting attractions.

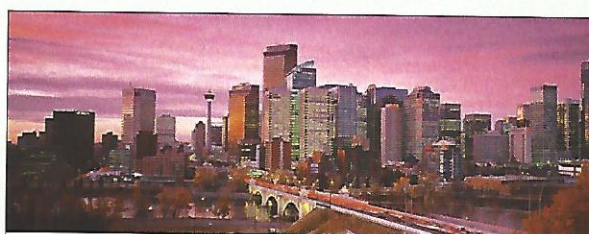


Banff National Park The spectacular sights in this park include Lake Louise and Moraine Lake as well as the mountains of the Canadian Rockies.

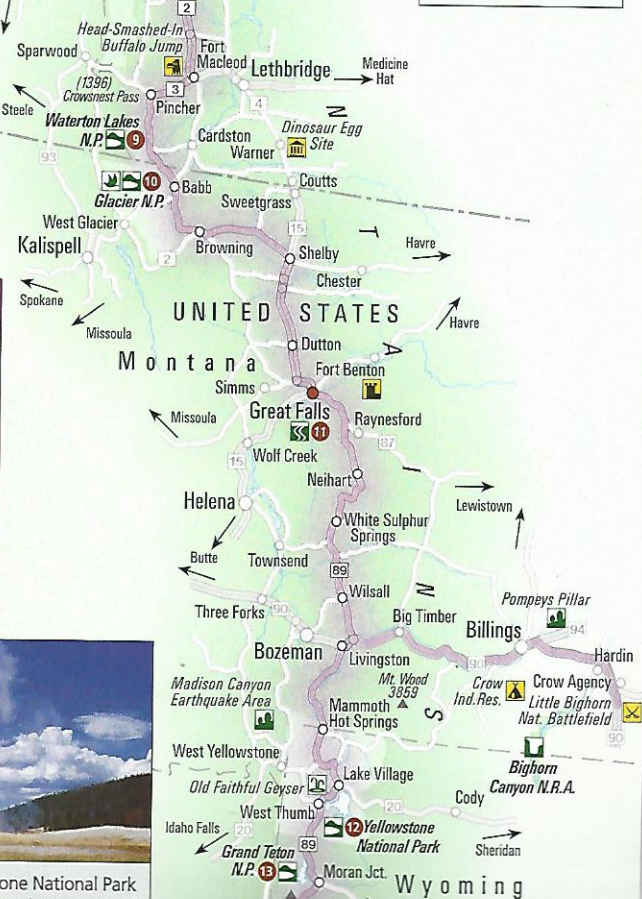

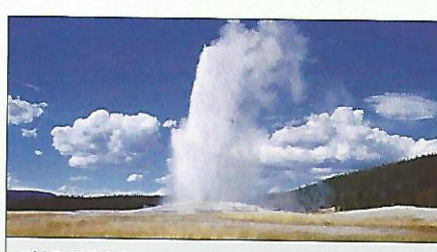
Fort Benton This small Montana city on the Missouri River was an important center for fur trading during the 19th century.
